### How you've made a difference

We're celebrating the one-year anniversary of the Newcastle Student Fund and want to reflect on how donations from our alumni and supporter community have made a real impact on student causes.

As a university, we are dedicated to fostering a culture of welcome and inclusion for all. We believe that ability, not circumstance, is what counts. Our aim is to give highly motivated and enthusiastic students from all backgrounds and contexts the benefit of a Newcastle University experience.

We know how important it is for you to be confident that your donations achieve the greatest possible impact. This is why we placed students, and those who work most closely with them, at the heart of the process of distributing your donations. The Fund is chaired by our Director of Student Life and overseen by a team of staff and students who play a critical role in ensuring your donations are spent effectively.

Thanks to your generous support, the Newcastle Student Fund has been used to offer assistance to four key areas of student life:

#### **Getting into Newcastle University**

By offering a suite of scholarships and bursaries for students who have overcome the greatest barriers to reaching higher education.

#### Making the most of student life

By giving students the freedom to enjoy all aspects of life at Newcastle without the fear of financial hardship.

#### Supporting students in times of greatest need

By providing immediate financial aid if things go wrong.

#### Getting ahead in the graduate job market

By funding opportunities and programmes which boost student employability and support our promising entrepreneurs. £370,000

has been raised so far for the Newcastle Student Fund

## Supporting students to get into higher education

One of the aims of the Newcastle Student Fund is to ensure that university is open to the brightest, most motivated students, whatever their background.

The North East is the region in which young people are least likely to access higher education, and this gap is widening. The region has the lowest application rate to higher education (33.7%) and the second lowest entry rate (29.6%) in England. We know that with the right help and support, a university education has the ability to transform the fortunes of less-advantaged young people and open up a world of opportunities.

This year, the Newcastle Student Fund has been used to support two exceptional programmes to help future generations access higher education – a partnership with the national educational outreach charity **Into**University and our Sanctuary Scholarships programme, offering support for refugees and asylum seekers. We have ambitions to offer more access scholarships and with your help we can continue to support initiatives that alleviate barriers to accessing a world-class education.

### **IntoUniversity Newcastle East**

Your donations enabled us to open the first IntoUniversity Education Centre in the region in collaboration with Northumbria University. IntoUniversity is an educational charity which has over 30 centres in disadvantaged communities to help students aged 7-18 realise their ambitions and achieve.

IntoUniversity has proven evidence of impact with 66% of its students progressing to university, compared with 26.6% of students from similar backgrounds nationally in 2021. Our centre, in the heart of Walker, was opened in Autumn 2021 and aims to work with over 1,000 students each year.

### Sanctuary Scholarships

Newcastle University is proud to be a University of Sanctuary, providing a safe community for students and academics affected by war, conflict and persecution to learn and thrive.

Sanctuary Scholarships have been designed to enable students from asylum-seeker and refugee backgrounds to progress to higher level study. With your help, we have provided 5 Sanctuary Scholars in 2021-22 with full tuition fee support and a bursary for living expenses. This for an undergraduate student amounts to £21,950 per year.



# Supporting students to make the most of their university experience

### We believe all students should be able to enjoy the full Newcastle University experience.

Even after students overcome obstacles to get into university, they often face financial barriers and need additional support to succeed whilst studying. At Newcastle, over 20% of our students come from families with low incomes.

With your support, we have been able to help more students fully embrace their university experience and have been able to further invest in student-led initiatives to widen access to travel, sport, culture, innovation and enterprise.

Below are some examples of how the Student Fund has been used to support vital projects:



#### **Participation Bursaries**

These bursaries help remove financial obstacles that prevent students from accessing the activities offered by the Students' Union. The bursary contributes to the cost of getting involved, such as club and society membership fees, trips, as well as sports kits and equipment. This year, an additional 97 bursaries were awarded thanks to donations to the Student Fund.

#### Students' Union activities

Support has also been provided to several clubs in the Students' Union to help ensure there are no barriers to accessing these activities, such as the Wheelchair Basketball Club and the Student Media Conference.



#### **Research and Expedition Scholarships**

These awards allow students to spend a summer overseas conducting field research. The opportunity to experience research-led learning and to develop key skills through a wide range of activities is an important part of the university experience and equips our students for life after study. 39 groups of students will receive scholarships this summer thanks to you.



Jin-De Lin is a postgraduate Biomedical Engineering student and a recipient of the Participation Bursary, he said:

"As an international student I think it is a hard mission to come here and learn. Every single payment in my normal life, such as grocery shopping, I really have to budget for and can't waste money. I found out there was a Sport Centre during my first month here, but I knew I couldn't afford to allocate money towards a membership. "It is thanks to the Participation Bursary that I was able to fund my membership for the Sports Centre. It has really helped me because learning and studying all day for a full year without exercise is not sustainable. I really appreciate that the donations have allowed me to be able to exercise, to do something that I enjoy but also to provide me with the opportunity to take a break from my studies."



"The funding given to the Wheelchair Basketball Club is monumental and to a large extent life-changing for our players. We've bought 7 wheelchairs for the university with the funding provided, which allows us to put on sessions and set up a team to compete in BUCS next year. That said it's more than just a competitive club, it's an opportunity for sport to have able-bodied and disabled players competing on the same court, same team, same tactics together as one with no barriers in-between. Thank you for the funding, the difference it's going to make is going to be an amazing thing to witness."

## **Supporting students** in times of greatest need

The last year has seen an unprecedented need for emergency financial and welfare support as a result of both the pandemic and the terrible consequences of global conflict.

The Newcastle Student Fund stands ready to respond to urgent need. This year, the first awards were made to offer financial relief to our students in the aftermath of political unrest, following the invasion of Ukraine. Your donations were quickly deployed to support students whose lives were turned upside down by the conflict and will continue to help members of the Newcastle University community when they need it most.

We also know that our students closer to home experience financial hardship through no fault of their own. This year we have seen a rise of over 30% in applications for financial support, and this will no doubt continue to grow as the cost-of-living crisis worsens. Thanks to your support, we were ready and able to quickly respond to our students no matter what difficulty they faced, making emergency funds available through the Student Fund.

#### Students affected by political unrest

The Newcastle community has come together to offer support for people who have been directly affected by the events in Ukraine. 22 students have been helped so far, with £32,000 allocated from the Newcastle Student Fund, and we continue to work with our partners across the city to identify other ways in which we can provide support for all those seeking sanctuary and support.

#### **Student hardship**

Your generosity has helped 26 students avoid homelessness and exceptional financial hardship this year. £40,000 from the Student Fund has contributed to emergency accommodation and financial aid to support students at times of great difficulty. Our Student Wellbeing team provided pastoral support and counselling to these students during this difficult time.





## Supporting students to get ahead in their chosen career

We want to help prepare students for their future after university, by providing them with the opportunities and experiences necessary to get ahead in their chosen career.

We know it is vital to give our students that crucial competitive edge in the crowded job market. Employers are increasingly looking for ways to distinguish between candidates and we want to make sure Newcastle graduates shine.

With your help we have been able to fund crucial initiatives in partnership with our careers team, helping students as they take that first step into their career. Whether it's financial support to take part in internships with some of the biggest companies in the country, or providing start-up funding for our young entrepreneurs, your donation has helped our students get ahead.

#### **START UP support**

Newcastle University's award-winning careers service supports hundreds of students and graduates to grow their business ideas from concept to reality, through our dedicated START UP team. There are currently 203 START UP-supported businesses trading worldwide, creating 947 full-time equivalent jobs and with a combined annual turnover of close to £88 million.
